## **COMPETITION ADMINISTRATION ANNUAL REPORT FOR FNCCC 2024/25 SEASON**

What a start we had to season 24/25! Around 12 turf wickets and half a dozen synthetics all out at the same time with more need than ever for them. With great resilience and the can-do attitude of the Far North Coast, we just got in and got it done. Thank you to the Executive of the Far North Coast Cricket Council and all the Associations, Clubs and teams that each helped in their own way to get cricket played under less than ideal conditions during this period.

2024/25 saw the FNCCC open its 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade competition to include NRCL Clubs which resulted in a change to that competition to an expanded 16 teams into North and South pools. This supported the FNCCC vision of more teams playing similar level opposition across the grades. This will then filter down into the local 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Grade teams with similar outcomes in the coming seasons.

## FAR NORTH COAST REGIONAL ACADEMY REPORT 2024 SEASON

Expressions of interest to be selected to participate in the FNC Academy were posted to the FNC Academy Face Book page in April and were to be followed by trials but unfortunately poor weather prevented us from holding them.

Interest from the region was again very strong, we also added a girls program to the Academy this year which was well received and I believe will grow over the coming years.

Registrations were this year handled via PlayHQ.

All players were set up in PlayHQ as FNC Rep players and ready for any matches that we would be playing.

This years program ran across 12 weekends ( 6 sessions per age group )

Week 1 was programmed for junior players, U12 9am - 12pm, U13 10am -1pm & U14 1pm - 4pm.

Week 2 was programmed for seniors and the Girls, U15 9am - 12pm, U16 10am - 1pm & Girls 1pm - 4pm.

Two of the sessions were postponed due to poor weather, however we were able to catch these up.

I would like to thank all my coaches for their dedication during the academy program as without their collective knowledge and dedication to cricket the academy program could not have functioned as well as it did.

The Bradman cup trials were held in Woolgoolga with all three regional coaches in attendance for the Bradman selections.



### **NSW Youth Championship**

The NSW Youth Championships were held in Clarence for the U13's, Grafton for the U14's and Ballina for the U15's.

Our U13 side finished 5th on the ladder only picking up 3 wins but were unlucky to lose one after a weather disrupted match saw the Run Rate Calculation basically hand the win to their opponents

There is a lot of promise with this group and I feel they did not perform to the level they are capable of, we are looking forward to seeing them develop over the next few years

Our U14 side finished 5th on the ladder and had a challenging year with a few players becoming unavailable just prior to the carnival commencing.

Our U15 squad finished 3rd on the ladder, the side has a lot more ability than the results showed but failed to get it all to gel in a couple of matches.

This year we managed to add matches vs the Gold Coast Reps prior to the commencement of the CNSW Youth Challenge. There were a lot of positives taken from these matches and it also gave the U16 academy players a nice way to finish off their Academy time.

## FAR NORTH COAST CU&SA REPORT ON 2024/25 SEASON

The 2024-25 season saw some FNCCU&SA members achieve significant milestones. NSWCUSA has recognized Pat Holt who officiated his 650th match during the season, while Bill Battese reached 600 matches, Graham Rose and Peter Kent 500, Ray Fraser 400, Wayne Garrard & Doug Trigg 200, Ken Bridge and Chen Tay 100. The following attained 50 matches officiated - Kevin Ayres, Dee Jeffree, Kate Rowlands, Shane Purse, Greg Mariager and Tim Somerville. Significantly John Fallows and Greg Mariager achieved their Level 2 NSW Accreditation.

We again hosted the NSWCUSA Education team for a pre-season Professional Development course attended by members. Darren Goodger, Bede Sajowitz and Paul Dilley presented an excellent program covering game management, focusing on player behaviour and code of conduct implementation, LBW & No ball laws interpretation, fielder absence and penalty time implementation plus an update on Officials HQ. The course was very well supported with 23 attendees.

Our association expanded its umpiring numbers with 4 new members officiating during the season. Owen Turner and Dave Whitby joined us from Clarence, while Kevin Ayres returned to officiating after a season off and Allan Virtue joined us after a move from Victoria. Steve Beaton from Tamworth also joined us but is yet to officiate in grade competition matches.

The relocation of long-standing member Peter Kent to live in Queensland saw us lose a leading official. We wish Peter well with his umpiring on the Sunshine Coast.

Season 2024-25 saw 20 'regulars' being appointed to FNCCC competitions including LJ Hooker League, FNC 2nd grade, Northern Rivers Cricket League plus FNC Junior Inter-district. Bill Battese, Graham Rose and Kate Rowlands led the games 'ladder' officiating 39, 36 and 31 games, respectively. Each had a very busy representative schedule as outlined later in this report. Congratulations to Kate on being selected to umpire her first LJ Hooker final, along with Ray Fraser.

We were also able to appoint umpires to officiate semi-finals and finals in Ballina and Tweed associations across both senior and junior competitions. It was a pity that many of these finals matches were impacted by wet weather resulting in wash outs.

## FNC Veterans Cricket Report 2024-25 Season

FNC 'Vets' had a very successful 2024-25 season, with the number of players and teams growing with the introduction of a Winter O 45's competition. This competition in July & August included 3 teams of FNC players and a team from Lower Clarence. The format was based upon NSW Vets format, 40 over ODI, batters retire at 40 and recycle, pink balls, turf wickets & an official umpire standing. We completed an 8-match season with Bush-Stone Curlews, captained by Levi Shouldice, winning the grand-final. 63 registered players, 42 of those new to veterans' cricket. Thanks to Lennox Head & Tintenbar EB CC for preparation of wickets & use of facilities.

The competition was so successful it has expanded to 5 teams this winter with a team from Grafton joining.
